The most competitive applications contain the attributes listed below. How does yours measure up? Check all that apply.

- Your proposal aligns with Tyson’s corporate priorities of **providing hunger relief** and **assisting our hourly team members** and their families. (You may also submit proposal ideas outside of those target areas in the “open-at-large” category.)
- You have performed due diligence to ensure that the people who will ultimately benefit from your Tyson Foods community grant live within 20 minutes of a Tyson plant.
- Your proposal’s “performance target” clearly describes what you are striving to achieve.
- Your proposal outlines major milestones to demonstrate what needs to be accomplished as you strive toward your performance target.
- Your project budget broadly explains how you will spend Tyson’s grant award to accomplish your performance target.
- Your application explains how you are currently leveraging or plan to leverage other financial and staff resources.
- Your proposal includes a copy of your organization’s most recent audited financial statement.
- You have informed Tyson’s local management team about your community grant project, and they have agreed to let you name them as supporters of your project.
- You have ensured that Tyson team members from local plants are willing to deepen Tyson’s level of engagement with your organization by volunteering or making product donations.
- A Tyson team member serves on your board of directors.
- You have outlined your plans to promote the award and the progress it achieves on social media and your website.
